Renovation, Renovation, Renovation

The Medical Library renovation kicked off on June 30.

Phase 1 will convert the area occupied by the Dirksen and Stevenson conference rooms, the Library training room, the group study rooms, and the media / quiet study area into stacks and quiet study. The training room will remain in its original location but is closed during the renovation.

Phase 2 will focus on the current public services areas for circulation and reference and the books stacks on the east side of the Library, as well as a new location for the Dirksen and Stevenson conference rooms.

Phase 3 will convert the remainder of the book stacks and public space to small group study rooms and collaborative spaces.

The renovation work occurs between 6:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m., and the Library remains open during the renovation.

EndNote Site License



The Medical Library has joined with SIUC Morris Library to share a site license to EndNote Desktop X7 bibliographic management software.

The license is limited to fac-

ulty and graduate students, with the Medical Library including medical students and residents in the license.

A Day in the Life of a Third-Year Medical Student

As part of a multi-institutional research project, twelve (12) members of the class of 2015 were asked to map a day in March when they had clinical responsibilities.

The then third-year students were interviewed the following day to review their movements and where and how

they interacted with information and information tools.

The interview recordings were transcribed, and a project meeting was held in July with the project anthropologist / consultant to develop a coding rubric for the transcripts.

After each institution codes

their transcripts, the group will meet again in September to analyze the results.

Participating institutions include medical schools at SIU, Loyola University, Midwestern University, Rush University, University of Chicago (lead institution), and the University of Illinois at Chicago.

NEJM Backfile

The Library has purchased the full online back-file (back to 1812) of the New England Journal of Medicine.

It can be accessed through the e-Journals A-Z list or as part of the Find-It SIUSM menu

This is part of the move to decrease the space devoted to print journals while expanding access to their electronic counterparts. NEJM currently occupies over 20 shelves in the collection.

Academic Search Complete: Upgraded Access

Through the Library's membership in the Consortium of Academic and Research Libraries in Illinois (CARLI), library users now have access to *Ebsco Academic Search Complete*, a comprehensive multidisciplinary database with more than 9,500 full-text journals, 7,850 of

which are peer-reviewed.

Academic Search Complete replaced *Academic Search Premiere* and is available through the Ebscohost Research Databases link on the Library's home page (<http://www.siumed.edu/lib/>).

Individual journals are linked through the e-journals search box and the e-journals A-Z list (<http://sfx.carli.illinois.edu/sfxsim/a-z>). Using either approach will ensure that access is available both on and off-campus through our proxy server.

E-book access via CARLI PDA Pilot Program

The Consortium of Academic and Research Libraries in Illinois (CARLI) is offering a patron driven acquisition (PDA) e-book program.

More than 29,000 e-book records have been loaded into the I-Share database. If you retrieve one of these titles, you may use it for five minutes and then will be asked to borrow it. Loans

are for seven days.

CARLI has negotiated an arrangement with the e-book vendor that allows multiple short-term loans, before the consortium is charged for the e-book acquisition. This allows exposure to many titles, while restricting payment only to those titles that are actually used.

The pilot is focusing on the social sciences and humanities, but health policy and ethics are both topics that are represented.

New Streaming Video Collections

And a third mention of our great state-wide consortium (CARLI)...through our CARLI membership, we have gained access to three new streaming video collections

from the Alexander Street Press. These are in process of being added to our online catalog. The new additions are: *Counseling and Therapy in Video Volumes I and II* (we

already have III) and *Nursing Assessment*. CARLI is supporting the cost of access to these collections for 10 years on behalf of its members.

Highlighted Resource : Online AMA Manual of Style



The *AMA Manual of Style* is an essential tool for those engaged in medical and scientific publishing. The Medical Library has added online access to the *AMA Manual of Style: A Guide for Authors and Editors (10th edition)*.

Features include:

- ◆ Quick search and advanced search options to search the full text of the book.
- ◆ Browse the table of contents and the index and jump quickly to the section that you want.
- ◆ View content on-screen, print in print-friendly format, or download to PDF.

- ◆ Interactive SI Conversion calculator lets you quickly convert units of measure.
- ◆ Create a personal profile to allow you to save content and searches for future visits.
